All these Lodges welcome new members and those wishing to become Freemasons, who are undergraduates, postgraduates, senior members of the

university and alumni, ranging in age from 18 upwards.

The Lodge dates back to 1919 and in 2020 the Lodge celebrated its centenary. It was then relaunched as the first University Scheme Lodge in the Province of Northamptonshire and Huntingdonshire

and increase their social interaction especially if you are studying away from family and friends, as well as providing support and offering the right tools to build self-confidence and life skills that last far beyond their time at university.
